Additives Might Improve Chiller Energy Efficiency

GAITHERSBURG, Md.—A National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) researcher has developed a method to improve the energy efficiency of commercial water chillers. NIST research found that some lubricants, when injected in small amounts, can enhance evaporator heat transfer, increasing the efficiency of chillers. NIST says that certain additives form a thin covering on an evaporator surface, which produces enhanced bubbling during boiling. The improved conversion of the refrigerant molecules into vapor molecules increases the chiller's cooling capacity.

USGBC Launches Web-Based Training Course

WASHINGTON, D.C.—The U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) has launched its first Web-based training course designed to educate building industry professionals about Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED®) professional accreditation requirements. The three-hour course, "Essentials of LEED Professional Accreditation" includes selected case studies, interactive learning exercises, and a practice exam with questions similar to those on the LEED Professional Accreditation exam.
